## Terms

<b>advisals</b>	an act or instance of giving advice
<b>affidavit</b>	document in which a person states facts, swearing that the facts are true and accurate
<b>alien</b>	an individual who is not a U.S. citizen or U.S. national
<b>A-number</b>	alien registration number which the Department of Homeland Security assigns to each alien
<b>asylum</b>	protection granted by a nation to someone who has left their native country as a political refugee
<b>biometrics</b>	refers to metrics related to human characteristics and traits
<b>Board of Immigration Appeals</b>	also referred to as the Board, BIA
<b>Cal DOJ</b>	usually in reference to forms to be filled out in the California hearings
<b>cancellation of removal</b>	form of immigration relief available to individuals who have been placed in removal proceedings before the EOIR
<b>CBP</b>	U.S. Customs and Border Protection
<b>C.F.R.</b>	abbreviation for the Code of Federal Regulations
<b>CIMT</b>	crime involving moral turpitude
<b>consulate</b>	An office of the U.S. Department of State located overseas and affiliated with a U.S. embassy in that country's capital city.
<b>Convention Against Torture (CAT)</b>	internal human rights treaty, under the review of the United Nations, that aims to prevent torture and cruel treatment around the world
<b>counsel</b>	refers to attorneys
<b>country conditions</b>	extensive collection of information about the conditions in countries around the world
<b>DACA</b>	Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (often pronounced "dock-ah")

<b>DAPA</b>	Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents
<b>DHS</b>	Department of Homeland Security; the Department
<b>EOIR</b>	Executive Office for Immigration Review (often pronounced "ee-yore")
<b>EOIR-28 (or E-28)</b>	Notice of Entry of Appearance by attorney or representative
<b>estoppel</b>	Set of doctrines in which a court prevents a litigant from taking an action he/she normally would have the right to take, in order to prevent an inequitable result
<b>EWI</b>	Entry Without Inspection (often pronounced "eee-wee")
<b>FOIA</b>	Freedom of Information Act (often pronounced "foy-ah")
<b>Holder</b>	Eric Holder; former U.S. Attorney General; included in many case cites
<b>HRIFA</b>	Haitian Refugee Immigration Fairness Act (often pronounced "Ha-riffa")
<b>I-485</b>	Application to Register Permanent Residence or to Adjust Status
<b>I-589</b>	Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal
<b>IBIS</b>	Interagency Border Inspection System
<b>ICE</b>	Immigration and Customs Enforcement
<b>id.</b>	is the term used to provide an endnote or footnote citation or reference for a source that was cited in the preceding endnote or footnote
<b>IHP</b>	Institutional Hearing Program
<b>INA</b>	Immigration and Nationality Act
<b>info pass</b>	free service that lets you schedule an appointment with a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Immigration Officer by using the Internet at any time of day or night.
<b>in absentia</b>	conducted without the alien's presence after the alien failed to appear as required

<b>in re</b>	in the legal case of; in regard to
<b>INS</b>	Immigration and Naturalization Service
<b>instant case</b>	the case currently before the court
<b>ipso facto</b>	by that very fact or act
<b>Istanbul protocol</b>	A way to support your claim that you were tortured and how to go about supporting it
<b>IIRIRA</b>	Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (sounds like "Ira-Ira")
<b>Lionbridge</b>	name of an interpretation/translation service that commonly appears in EOIR hearings
<b>LPR</b>	lawful permanent resident
<b>Lynch</b>	Loretta Lynch, former U.S. Attorney General; included in many case citations
<b>mandamus</b>	a judicial writ issued as a command to an inferior court or ordering a person to perform a public or statutory duty
<b>maras</b>	Latin American gangs
<b>Mara Salvatrucha</b>	MS-13; specific Central American/U.S. gang
<b>master calendar</b>	short, preliminary hearing on immigration matters
<b>mens rea</b>	in criminal law, is viewed as one of the necessary elements of some crimes
<b>merits hearing</b>	also known as "individual hearing"; respondent will be able to present documentary evidence for the court's consideration
<b>Mukasey</b>	Michael Mukasey, former U.S. Attorney General; included in many case citations
<b>NACARA</b>	Nicaraguan Adjustment and Central American Relief Act
<b>nolo contendere</b>	legal term that comes from the Latin for "I do not wish to

contend."

<b>nolle prosequi</b>	meaning "will not prosecute;" pronounced as "no-lay-pro-say-kwee"; sometimes said as "nolle prossed" in past tense
<b>notario</b>	trained legal professionals who provide legal advice and draft legal documents (they are not generally permitted to represent aliens in removal proceedings)
<b>Notice of Intent to Deny (NOID)</b>	a formal statement from USCIS that it has determined that the applicant is ineligible for the immigrant benefit requested
<b>Notice to Appear (NTA)</b>	charging document that signals the initiation of removal proceedings against an alien (please capitalize)
<b>nunc pro tunc</b>	refers to changing back to an earlier date of an order, judgment or filing of a document
<b>pretermit</b>	to ignore or disregard purposely
<b>prima facie</b>	based on the first impression; accepted as correct until proved otherwise
<b>prosecutorial discretion (PD)</b>	refers to the power that ICE has on to influence a deportation case
<b>REAL ID Act</b>	enacted in 2005, aims to create national standards for state-issued driver's licenses and ID cards
<b>Sessions</b>	Jeff Sessions; current U.S. Attorney General; included in many case citations
<b>Shepardizing</b>	refers to the process of consulting Shepard's Citations to see if a case has been overturned, reaffirmed, questioned, or cited by later cases
<b>SIJ</b>	Special Immigration Juveniles (sometimes pronounced as "sidge")
<b>SOSI</b>	SOS International; an interpretation service DOJ uses
<b>sua sponte</b>	Latin: "of his, her, its or their own accord"
<b>supra</b>	academic or legal term meaning "mentioned above or earlier"
<b>televideo</b>	one word, lower case; hearings held where the respondent is

<b>TPS</b>	Temporary Protected Status
<b>USC</b>	United States Citizen (i.e. USC spouse, USC child, USC parents)
<b>U.S.C.</b>	The Code of Law of the United States of America (United States Code, U.S. Code); often cited in Oral Decisions
<b>USCIS</b>	United States Citizenship and Immigration Services
<b>U visa</b>	gives victims of certain crimes temporary legal status and work eligibility in the U.S. for up to four years
<b>VAWA</b>	Violence Against Women Act (sounds like “vah-wah”)
<b>voluntary departure</b>	the departure of an alien from the U.S. without an order of removal
<b>withholding of removal</b>	relief that prevents removal to a country where the alien has a clear probability of suffering persecution based on race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in a particular social group
<b>your honor</b>	always lower case

## Languages

There are several languages/dialects that have multiple spellings. The following is a list of spellings used by DOJ. If you encounter a language that has multiple spellings but is not included on this list, just make sure that it is spelled consistently throughout all of your files.

- Aguacateco (alternatively spelled Awakatek, Aguateco, Awaketec, Coyotin, Chalchitec, Balamihá, or Qa'yol)
  - Mayan language spoken primarily in Guatemala
- Akateko (alternatively spelled Akatek or Acateco)
  - Mayan language spoken primarily in Guatemala
- Foo Chow (alternatively spelled Fuzhou, Foochow, or Hok-chiu)
  - Chinese dialect
- Jacalteco Popti (alternatively spelled Jakaltek, Jakalteco, or Popti)
  - Mayan language spoken primarily in Guatemala
- Konjobal (alternatively spelled Q'anjob'al or Kanjobal)
  - Mayan language spoken primarily in Guatemala/Mexico
- Pidgin English (Pidgin is pronounced the same way as "pigeon")
- Quiche (alternatively spelled Ki'che')
  - Mayan language spoken primarily in Guatemala
- Romanian-Moldovan
- S'gaw Karen (alternatively spelled Sgaw Karen, Sgaw Kayin, or Karen)
  - Language spoken primarily by ethnic groups in Myanmar and Thailand
- Tigrigna (alternatively spelled Tigrinya)
  - Language spoken primarily in southern Eritrea and northern Ethiopia
